Lighting of the First, Second, Third and Forth Advent Candle:

Clifford Family

One:

We light the first Advent candle acknowledging HOPE is still with us praying that nation shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation; neither shall they learn war anymore.

(Light one purple candle)

We light the second Advent candle and commit to be a channel of PEACE in our community as we remember the scripture image of the wolf shall dwelling with the lamb, the leopard lying down with the kid, the calf with the lion, and the fatling together, and a little child leads them.

(Light one purple candle)

We light the third Advent candle of JOY maintaining the joy of the Lord in all circumstances as we remember the wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing.

(Light the pink candle)

We light the fourth Advent candle of LOVE remembering Isaiah 7:14, "The Lord will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son and shall name him Immanuel (God is with us).

(Light the purple candle)

ALL: Let us walk in the love of Christ.


Calling all Knitters and Crocheters!

What is JaM? Children's Choir for South Aiken Presbyterian Church Who is this for? 4K and Older Youth


Where will this be held? South Aiken Presbyterian Church's Fellowship Hall


